MLA In-Text Citation. Italicize the titles of books mentioned in the text. Write book titles within the text, not in parenthetical citations. For example, "In the novel Being in Love, Smith has defined love as a social impulse." Italicize "Being in Love." List the name of the author in parentheses, along with the page number you are referencing.

Make an exception if words in the title are usually italicized and set them in normal type instead; this is called reverse italicization. Consider section 4.07 of the APA Publication Manual, " Quotation Marks;" according to it, quotes should be used to set off the title of books, articles, and chapters when you are including it in the text. Check your writing to make sure you ' re following the previous two guidelines; the article you mention in your text should be formatted as follows:

Provide the title of the work. For a full video, place the title of the video in italics immediately following the first name or names that you listed in your citation. Use the same capitalization as in the video itself. If you're citing a shorter clip, put the title in quotation marks rather than in italics.

Add source information to cite a reproduction of a painting. If you viewed the painting in a book or online, rather than in person, include the author, title, date of publication, and publication information at the end of your reference list entry. Follow the same format as you normally would to cite a webpage or an article inside a book.

For an in-press work, use " in press " for the date in both the reference list entry and in-text citation. For a work with no date, use " n.d. " in both the reference list entry and the in-text citation. Italics in the Title and Source Italic formatting within the title or source varies by reference and is not shown in the table.

Missing Reference Information - APA Style

When a source has no known author, use a shortened title of the work instead of an author name. Place the title in quotation marks if it's a short work (such as an article) or italicize it if it's a longer work (e.g. plays, books, television shows, entire Web sites) and provide a page number if it is available.

APA citation basics When using APA format, follow the author-date method of in-text citation. This means that the author's last name and the year of publication for the source should appear in the text, like, for example, (Jones, 1998). One complete reference for each source should appear in the reference list at the end of the paper.

Title the page ' References ' Place ' References ' in the center of the page and bold it. Keep the title in the same font and size as the references. Do not italicize, underline, place the title in quotation marks, or increase the font size.
